School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it? This is a plan that describes how St. Marys Elementary will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. St. Marys Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents in order to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. How is it revised? St. Marys Elementary School invited all parents to attend our annual Stakeholder Input meeting last spring to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the school wide plan, our school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our annual Stakeholder Input Meeting. All efforts are made to address opportunities for regular meetings and events as requested by parents. The school will submit any parent comments to the Director of Federal Programs, Dr. Denise Cato, if Title I school-wide plan is not satisfactory to parents.

What feedback indicated? The yearly survey showed that parents wanted more information about their child is learning and the instructional program. We will provide information and/or workshops on improving state standards, student reading skills, improving student math skills, and test information. Workshops/meetings will be held at flexible times.

Who is it for? All students and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. St. Marys Elementary School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of students with disabilities, parents of migratory children, as well as guardians of children served through the Methodist Children's Home. St. Marys Elementary School will offer childcare and transportation to the extent practicable upon request.

Where is it available? The Title 1 plan is posted on-line on the school website, in the parent resource center, and in the front office.

2023-2024 District Goals

- To increase the percentage of students in grades 3- 12 meeting proficient or higher on the GMAS ELA EOC/EOG from 53% to 56% (ES), from 52% to 55% (MS), and from 59% to 62% (HS).
- To increase the percentage of students in grades 3- 12 meeting proficient or higher on the GMAS Science EOC/EOG from 64% to 67% (ES), from 59% to 62% (MS), from 66% to 69% (HS).
- To increase the percentage of students in grades 3- 12 meeting proficient or higher on the GMAS Math EOC/EOG from 59% to 62% (ES), from 47% to 50% (MS), from 50% to 53% (HS).

2023-2024 School Goals

- To increase the percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient or distinguished on the GMAS ELA EOG from 52% to 57%.
- To increase the percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient or distinguished on the GMAS Math EOG from 58% to 63%.
- To increase the number of students, present 10% or more of enrolled school days from 84.16% to 87.16%.

Elementary School Promotion Standards

Grades 1-5

Students must pass language arts, reading, mathematics, science, and social studies and connections courses as they apply.

- All students in grades 1 2 must have passing final grades of 70% or higher in language arts and mathematics with a E or S in science and social studies.
- All students in grades 3 5 must have passing final grades of 70% or higher in language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies.
- 3rd Grade students must also pass the Reading of the Georgia Milestones EOG.
- 5th Grade students must also pass the Reading AND Mathematics portions of the Georgia Milestones EOG. Click HERE for further information
